The use of photographic film was pioneered by George Eastman. His first camera, which he called the "Kodak," was offered for sale in 1888. By 1900, mass-market photography took root with the "Brownie", his simple and very inexpensive box camera that introduced the concept of the snapshot. The Brownie was extremely popular and various models remained on sale until the 1960's.

Perhaps it is with one of these early camera's your family photos were taken. The pride and patriotism you feel when you see generations of your family in old black and white photos, dressed in military uniforms, off to fight for our freedom and safety. The statue of the Minute Man on The Green in Lexington, MA was captured on film during a vacation learning about the American Revolution and our succession from oppressive British rule. I love its old deckle-edges and the learning that came with immersion into the battle grounds in Concord and the Old North Bridge where the "Shot heard round the World" was fired. Once color film arrived, the photos brought a vivid dimension to our memories. The family July 4th gatherings, chock full of blueberry pie, Grandma in a red apron and bunting on the barn, were captured along with smiles and quality time together.

These are the pictures I have in my mind of July 4th, but what are yours? Join us as we celebrate with this years' Parade theme, "Pictures of Patriotism".

Break out the bunting and flags, as the house-decorating contest will be judged early in the morning. Roads will be closed at 9:00 AM for the safety of all participants and spectators.
